

**In October 2004, the Afghan people** went to the polls to elect their President in the country's first ever democratic election. One year on, another general election is being held – this time to appoint the parliament. But despite the evidence of progress, Afghanistan is still struggling with its past.

What are the implications of foreign military presence in Afghanistan? Will the elected parliament be a guarantor for legitimacy? Is Afghanistan a developing democracy or an occupied state?

**Over the course of two days,** November 18-19, the Swedish Committee for Afghanistan, SCA, will host an international seminar in Stockholm, bringing together several of the worlds' leading experts on democracy and Afghanistan.
